# Seeds of giving; lives of purpose!



"Our sponsors provide the seeds that grow into something bigger, something that will grow for years and years." So says Amy Soderstrom, co-founder of the Happy Flappy Brothers team which participates in the Autism Society of North Carolina's annual Eastern Run/Walk for Autism in Greenville, NC. Team co-founder Christie Kay agrees, "Every seed has helped us to grow the Run/Walk event each year which in turn supports the growth of programming for individuals with autism across their lives."

Both Amy and Christie have been involved with the Autism Society of North Carolina (ASNC) since their children were in preschool twenty years ago. Amy has three sons, twins Isaac and Samuel, both on the autism spectrum and now 24 years of age, and Jacob; Christie has two boys, Cullen who is on the spectrum and 24 years old, and Christopher, his younger brother.


Two decades ago, the Eastern Run/Walk for Autism was just a dream. It all started with Pitt County Support Group bake sales and other fundraisers that evolved into a Fun Run, and ultimately became the Eastern Run/Walk we know today. "It is astonishing to see how far we've come over the last 17 years," says Amy, who has watched as proceeds from the event helped to expand services available to her children and all individuals with autism in her community, including summer camp opportunities, social recreation programs, and more.

The Run/Walk for Autism is not only a critical fundraiser for ASNC, it is a crucial communitybuilding experience for individuals and families affected by autism. "It's like a giant family reunion," says Christie when describing the annual event. "It's a time when families don't have to worry about being accepted or worry about a child's behavior. Everyone there understands the journey they are on and that makes for a no-stress experience." For those new to an autism diagnosis, the Run/Walk for Autism offers a valuable perspective on what's possible. "It gives families a chance to see young children, teens, and adults with autism having happy and purposeful lives," says Amy, "and shows these families that there is a larger community out there for them to be part of."

Team Happy Flappy Brothers, which was established when three family teams joined forces to become one, participates in the Eastern Run/Walk every year. Its name reflects the deep friendships the team co-founders' sons share and the "autism flaps" the boys do as an expression of happiness. The team size varies each year, but generally has upwards of 100 participants including virtual participants from as far away as Ohio, Nevada, Oregon, and Hawaii.

Amy and Christie are both grateful for the sponsors who have supported the Eastern Run/Walk for Autism and who have made so much possible for individuals with autism in eastern North Carolina. Each sponsor's generosity shows the wider community that they support inclusiveness for those with special needs and that their businesses are safe, accepting places for individuals with autism and their families. "It's a big deal," says Christie, "when you understand that a sponsorship is the seed that grows into a garden of services that helps people with autism thrive and live their best, most independent lives."
